Petros Network took significant steps forward in 2021 despite COVID shutdowns and related global issues. Strife and persecution for our church planters continued to increase as political and economic pressures mounted, often resulting in violence. Tribal conflict, drought, pestilence, and soaring inflation also weighed heavily on our work. Despite the obstacles, the church grew, and destitute villages were met with hope.

When Jesus said, “Upon this rock, I will build my church,” he was standing in the center of Caesarea Philippi, the epicenter of the day for religious practices of every kind. And yet it was amid all that evil that Jesus made his grand declaration, “the gates of hell will not prevail.” (Matthew 16:18) What a great promise of hope. As we see our world spinning out of control, we can be confident God is at work.

You will see in this report that we experienced some of our most significant growth in 2021: Just over 1+ million new followers of Jesus and 5+ million people have been shared the Good News. We believe our numbers are underreported and God’s activity is even greater.

Other Significant Happenings:

- We, Ray and Linda Noah, resigned as Portland Christian Center’s Lead Pastors to focus 100% of our attention on the mission of Petros Network.
- We launched partnerships with two humanitarian organizations, which results in expanding sustainable farming, children’s feeding initiatives, and enriching women’s empowerment.
- We launched a pilot program with 150 church planters in sustainability projects.
- We launched into two new territories in the Sudanese Refugee Camps and Northern Uganda.
- We were able to get back in-country to visit and encourage our program center teams.

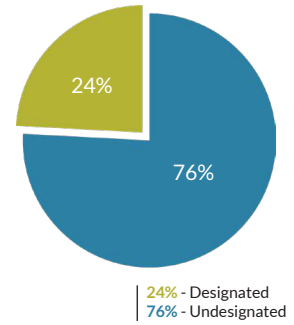

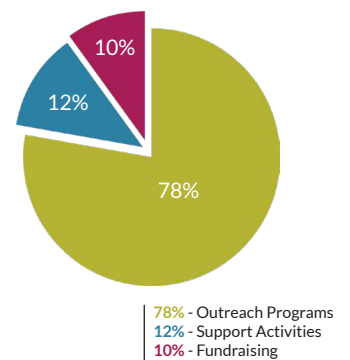

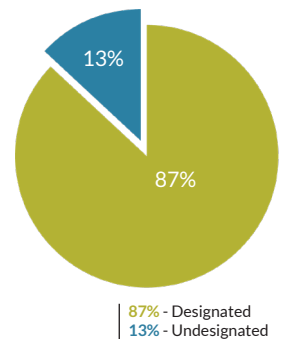

The result is Redemptive Lift. All community members, regardless of religious beliefs, are offered hope-filled opportunities that crush the confines of generational poverty and overflows into neighboring communities and families.

Petros Network believes the local church with an equipped indigenous leader is the hope of the developing world.
