

Preparing Your Personal Testimony for the Mission Field

A guide for Petros Network Goers

As a short-term team member with **Petros Network**, you are not only coming to serve—you're coming as a *witness* of the transforming power of Jesus Christ. One of the most impactful ways you can minister is by sharing your personal story of faith with authenticity and clarity.

A Biblical Example: The Man Born Blind

In **John 9**, Jesus healed a man who had been blind since birth. When confronted by religious leaders, the man didn't debate theology—he simply told his story. He spoke plainly about his life before Jesus, what Jesus had done for him, and the change that followed.

His words were simple yet powerful: *"One thing I do know: I was blind but now I see!"* (John 9:25)

Likewise, your story doesn't need to be complicated—or long. In just **three to four minutes**, you can share a clear and personal testimony of what Jesus has done in your life. When shared honestly, humbly, and with conviction, your story can powerfully point others to Him.

How to Prepare Your Testimony

You don't need to memorize a script, but you do want to prayerfully *prepare*. A well-crafted testimony usually includes these three parts:

1. Before Jesus

- What was your life like before knowing Christ?
- What was missing, broken, or difficult?
- What did you try to find hope, peace, or purpose?

2. Meeting Jesus

- What circumstances led you to consider following Christ?
- How did you come to trust Him as Lord and Savior?
- Share a favorite verse that impacted your journey.
- Briefly explain the gospel: God's love, Christ's sacrifice, and your response.

3. After Jesus

- How has your life changed since following Christ?
- How has God met your needs—emotionally, spiritually, or physically?
- What do you love most about your relationship with Jesus today?
